




Elena Baturina's BE OPEN Foundation launches educational initiative in Cyprus for the revitalization of traditional crafts









On 22-23 April, BE OPEN and CVAR will hold six educational sessions for Nicosia students, each consisting of a lecture on craft-related entrepreneurship and a masterclass on traditional Cypriot weaving.

The lecture will be based on the experience of Andreani Panayide, a young woman of Cypriot origin, who will share her journey from trying to explore her cultural heritage to founding her fashion label Folkmona, which markets accessories and clothing internationally. the master classes will be held by Elli Filokyprou, a weaver with over 20 years of experience, who runs her weaving workshop in the village of Gourri.

The courses entitled Cyprus Handcrafted Heritage – Classes with BE OPEN and CVAR have won encouragement from Dr. Philippa Karsera, First Lady of Cyprus: "We welcome all initiatives aimed at teaching the children of Cyprus about their culture and history, broadening their horizons and offering nurturing space for self-development. The format of the educational initiative developed by the BE OPEN Foundation is particularly exciting as it unites theory and practice, past and present, historical context and its contemporary application. We hope that this project will not only help transfer knowledge to children, but will inspire a genuine interest in our country's craft heritage."
